Concept

a) The State of Design periodically sends out Airworthiness Directives, Mandatory Service Bulletins and Airworthiness Notices. Such Bulletins and Directives may be received direct by Owners of aircraft / Operators or may be routed to the Airlines through the Department of Civil Aviation. All Bulletins and notices received by the Department will be forwarded to the relevant Airline Operators / Owners of aircraft.

In either case it is mandatory for Airline Operators / Owners of aircraft to comply with all such Bulletins and Notices, issued by the state of design of the aircraft.

It is mandatory for the Airline Operators / Owners of aircraft to record the compliance status of all such AD's and Bulletins in the applicable technical records.

It is the responsibility of the Owner/Operator to have a system in place to receive these Mandatory Airworthiness Directives and Service Bulletins in a timely manner.

b) In addition to the above, operators of airplanes over 5700 Kg should assess Airworthiness Notices and Service Bulletins of a non-mandatory nature. The assessment should be carried out by qualified personnel and assessments and action taken should be recorded for perusal by the DCA.
