

AIR OPERATOR CERTIFICATION

1. Regulations 185,186 and 187 of the Air Navigations Regulations of 1955, Chapter X11 require a person intending to operate an aircraft for aerial work, charter, or regular public transport services to obtain a licence to that effect from the Director General of Civil Aviation.
2. The application seeking approval shall be addressed to the Director General of Civil Aviation and Chief Executive Officer of the Civil Aviation Authority of Sri Lanka , 64, Supreme Building, Galle Road, Colombo 03, Sri Lanka.
3. The particulars required are as follows:-
 - a) Designation of Applicant.
Name in Full
Whether an individual, a partnership, registered company or corporation etc
Name and Nationality of Directors & Chief Executive Officer.
Brief description of the business experience of Directors.
 - b) Address of Applicant
Headoffice, Telephone, Facsimile and Email
Operating Headquarters Telephone, Facsimile and Email
 - c) Evidence of present corporate existence.
Place of incorporation, Copy of any act, Memorandum and Articles of Association, Certification of Incorporation, or other instrument from which the corporation derives powers and functions.
 - d) Nationality of ownership and control.
Proof of nationality of the interests holding substantial ownership and effective control of the applicant.
 - e) Class of service proposed.
Passengers only
Cargo Only
Passengers , Cargo and Mail.
 - f) Route permit
Evidence of Government approval to operate on specific routes.

- g) Particulars of connecting services.
Particulars regarding agreement with other carriers for Code-sharing, Block Seat arrangements etc.
 - h) Fares and Rates
Please furnish particulars of all fares and rates applicable to be charged on the proposed service.
 - i) Financial Status.
Deatails of the financial structure of the organization.
Proof of the paid-up capital / capital contribution
Certified copy of the applicants last balance sheet
Certified copy of the loss and profit account.
Cash flow account for the preceding two years.
If the applicant has not yet engaged in the business of air transportation,
particulars of plans for financing the proposed operation.
Investors (if any) and the nature of their contributions
 - j) Insurance details.
Present and proposed insurance coverage for employees, Passenger liability,
Cargo and liability to third party for injury or damage.
