a) Requirements:-

1. Age not less than 18 years.
2. Medical fitness (Class I).
3. Security Clearance.
4. Air law Examination and any other knowledge requirement depending on what state licence has been issued.
5. English Language Proficiency. (Level 4 or higher)
6. Shall hold a current licence together with a current Medical certificate issued by the foreign state.
7. Foreign CPL should have been issued in compliance with the minimum requirement of ICAO Annex I.
8. Verification of the licence from relevant foreign CAA.
9. Flying experience as “C” bellow.
10. All other requirement stipulated in ASN 055 Para 1.4.1.4

b) Supportive documents to be submitted:-

1. Duly completed Application for Issuance of CPL (CAA/PL/I/03).
2. Duly completed Personnel Particulars form (CAA/PL/M/12)
3. Duly completed Application for Medical Examination (CAA/PL/E/01)
4. Duly completed evaluation form for English Language Proficiency check (CAA/PL/E/08)
5. Foreign Licence.
6. Foreign Medical Certificate.
7. Log Book certified by flying training organization together with copies indicating total and recent flying experience.
8. Copy of NIC/Birth certificate.
9. Stamp Size 2 colour photos (2x2.5 cm)
10. Course completion certificate
11. Certificate of flying school approval
12. Detailed breakdown of flying experience
13. Skill test report and observer’s report.

c) Flying experience: - Refer Para 1.4.1.3 of ASN 055

1. For Commercial Pilot Licence.
 - Total 200 hrs, or 150 hrs if completed during a course of approved training
 - 100 hrs as PIC or in the case of a course of approved training, 70 hrs as PIC
 - Cross country 20 hrs as PIC. Not less than 540km (300NM) in the course of which full-stop landings at two different aerodromes shall be made.
 - Instrument 10 hrs. (Maximum ground time 05 hrs)
 - Night flying 5 hrs including 5 take-offs and 5 landings as PIC. (If night rating is sought)
2. For Instrument training.
 - Cross country 50 hrs as PIC
 - Instrument 40 hrs

d) Procedure:-

1. Submit Application for CPL conversion with supportive documents (above (b), 1 to 12).
2. Obtain security clearance.
3. Undergoing Medical Examination with a CAA Medical Examiner
4. Obtain Class I Medical Certificate.
5. Appear for following examinations at CAA.
 - Air Law Examination.
 - English Language Proficiency check
 - Skill test with appropriate type of Aircraft.
6. Obtain SPL. ***If you don’t have valid SPL & see the procedure for obtaining of SPL.***
7. Complete recent flying & hand over instructor report or log book copies. ***If you don’t have recent flying experience.***
8. Finally collect letter for flight test and complete it, Submit Examiner report & ATC observer’s report.
